Rewilding

A meeting was arranged between Somerset County Council Highways, Mendip District Council, Mrs Laura Sorensen, and members of the Parish Council. It was also attended by members of MWFT.

Following lengthy discussions on the whys and wherefores of planting the verges it was agreed that MWFT would provide a list of the work that they had already carried out and that which they planned to do in the future to the Parish Council for approval seven days prior to the monthly meetings. The Parish Council would then forward the agreed work to Highways to ensure any necessary licensing was in place. The future approval route for any work on the verges is initially MWFT to the Parish Council and then the Parish Council to Highways and/or Mendip District Council as appropriate.

The Parish Council did publish Mrs Sorenson's survey about rewilding in the parish magazine but no responses from parishioners were forthcoming.

Speed Limit between Meare & Westhay

The Council has agreed to fund a radar to ascertain the amount of speeding traffic between the two villages.

The response from Traffic Management Team is that there are guidelines on the setting of local speed limits and factors that need to be considered when reviewing a speed

limit such as history of collisions, road geometry and existing traffic speeds. Essentially, changes such as speed limits must be evidence-led.

A reduction to 50mph might be possible, but this would have to be Parish funded as upon reviewing the traffic speed and collision data for the Parish, this would not be a priority for Somerset County Council in terms of funding. Sadly, there are many other locations throughout the County where there are numerous recorded serious injuries and fatalities, the duty is therefore to direct their limited resources towards those sites.

The first step towards self-funded speed limit reduction would be a speed survey to ensure the current speeds are within the parameters for a speed reduction. However, it is worth bearing in mind that research has shown that a change in speed limit signs alone has very little effect on actual vehicle speeds and that the speed of vehicles is moderated by the surrounding environment rather than the posted speed limit. Where motorists do not understand the reasoning behind the implementation of a speed limit, a high level of non-compliance is likely to occur, and indeed this may lead to disrespect of speed limits elsewhere. A speed limit should encourage self-compliance.

The cost of radar equipment for one week is about £250. Meanwhile, a signing and lining inspection of the road between Meare and Westhay is planned to ensure all road markings and signs adhere to current guidelines.

Orange Street Lighting

Somerset County Council's Highways Lighting Team have informed the Parish Council that their policy is now to replace the old lanterns with LED lanterns only when they are no longer viable to repair.

With all local Councils under pressure to reduce carbon emissions the new LED lanterns on average give us an energy saving of 66%. This has a large impact on reducing Somerset's carbon emissions output and as a result is currently being rolled out throughout the County as and when budgets permit.

Thought for today – Do we care? Mike Strange.

As you watch the news from Ukraine, how does it make you feel? Heartbroken at the distress and suffering of ordinary families no different from our own? Outrage at the injustice? Appalled at the destruction of homes, heritage and environment? In the face of human tragedy on such scale, we may feel powerless. Unable to change the outcome.

"He looked around at them in anger and, deeply distressed at their stubborn hearts, said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was completely restored." Mark 3:5.

There were things that made Jesus angry. In this case it was people whose religious thinking stopped them from helping a fellow human who was suffering. According to the Bible, God hates things like injustice, selfishness, greed, harming children, exploiting the poor, and Jesus was outspoken in confronting them.

While the Bible also says much about, not losing your temper, not bearing grudges, and loving your enemies, some things should make us angry enough to care.

If we care, we would accept that there will be a personal cost for us. Certain things here will become expensive and in short supply. Refugees will need to be welcomed. Humanitarian and other forms of aid will need to be given. Local groups are even now asking for donations of essentials to provide to those fleeing the fighting (e.g., the Facebook group Help for Ukraine Taunton).

As we watch our television screens, these seem like small inconveniences.


