Somerset Wildlife Trust Banned Dogs

Emily Weatherburn from Somerset Wildlife Trust contacted me and ask if we could remind everyone that in August they banned dogs.

"Earlier this year, Somerset Wildlife Trust announced that dogs — with the exception of guide dogs — would be restricted to the public rights of way (the droves) on their Westhay Moor and Catcott Nature Reserves and that they would no longer be permitted on any central permissive paths. The restrictions have been in place since 15th August, at which time a spokesperson explained: "This isn't a decision we are taking lightly or without proper consideration. We know that there are lots of responsible dog owners who visit our reserves, and we regret the inconvenience this may cause them. Unfortunately, this decision has been made as a direct response to a growing number of irresponsible dog owners visiting our reserves. It is vital that we can make sure they remain safe havens for the rare and vulnerable species that make their homes there."

Children's Advocate or Visitor

Volunteer to be an Independent Visitor or Advocate for children in Somerset. These are fascinating and inspiring opportunities, which can bring real benefits to vulnerable children and young people, (travel and reasonable expenses are reimbursed). You can help children and young people understand their rights and ensure that their views, wishes and feelings are heard.

What is an Independent Visitor?

Independent visitors are volunteers who befriend and spend item with a child or young person who is in the area of the Local Authority. By law all local authorities have to provide an Independent Visitors service. In Somerset our intention is to encourage the relationship between the Independent Visitor and young person to continue beyond care. This way the care leavers continue to benefit from support, while making the transition to young adulthood. Independent Visitors are highly valued by the young people as they may be the only person involved in their lives who is not paid to be there.

What is an Advocate?

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings. Why not join our bank of advocates? You chose when you're available. Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability. Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills. Please contact us and we will arrange a short visit or call to explain more and discuss your options.

Clerks Report

Meare Parish Council received a presentation from a few young people recently, asking for their support in identifying appropriate additional recreation equipment for the parish and in time a financial contribution. In response, three Councillors are meeting with a group of young people with the intention of conducting a full consultation of their requirements. It is hoped they will report to the council at their November meeting.

There is no doubt that many people are being stretched financially and are concerned about rising energy and food costs. Meare Parish Council responded positively to two requests for support at their last meeting. Mrs Julie Tucker representing the Street Volunteer Drivers Service informed that many people are isolated by the absence of an appropriate public transport service. A recently launched service provides transport for people to access shopping, doctors and dentists appointments in the locality of Glastonbury and Street. In addition, Julie asked if anyone with some spare time and a car might consider becoming a driver for this service. Information on how to get involved has been placed on the village website and in the parish notice boards

Cllr Gayle Richards responded positively to a survey being conducted by the Local Council Association where community groups were asked if they are providing any 'warm spaces' over the winter months. The intention is that public spaces are made available to the public, where they are able to get warm, obtain some refreshments and importantly, socialise with others. Cllr Richards requested a contribution from the Parish Council to provide these facilities in the hall one Wednesday per month. Both of these contributions are important to ensuring that our residents are supported, particularly when life becomes more challenging.

Progress Update

We have been very busy since our last update. In our open meeting in June, we presented our plans to build the village hall in stages, which should mean we can start sooner and have an up and running hall quicker than before. We plan to build the hall in two stages now, with a smaller scale initial build. The first stage of the build will house the kitchen, the bar, toilets, the informal lounge area, entrance foyer and large meeting room/hall.

We have been working with our appointed architects Hill Reading Architects and our structural engineer. Having presented our reduced scale plans, we have had the building design updated accordingly and the drawings have been amended to allow the building to be tendered in two stages.

Having made these updates, we have now gone out to tender for the first stage build. At the time of writing, we are awaiting tender responses from interested contractors and will review these with the architect once these have been received.

Barrie Tidball and Jimmy Munckton have provided the following information:

This photo is probably taken just before a Cup Match between Meare and Blagdon, which was never finalized as the first match ended in a draw, the return match also ended in a draw so it was decided that both teams should share the cup for six months each.

Harold Munckton was their manager and a friend of George Clark. George was a very good footballer; he enjoyed a good career playing for Glastonbury in the late 50's and through to the late 60's. He played for Glastonbury when they were in the Western League and were a very good side and they then played in the Abbey Park.

When he retired from Glastonbury, Harold convinced him to come to Meare and "bring the young lads on". At that time Harold took Meare out of the Midsomerset League and into the Western League because it was much less travelling for them.

At first, they were in the 4th division but within 4 years, having won division 4,3 and 2 in consecutive years and then they won the 1st division in either the 1st or 2nd year in it. George played a significant role in their success.

As was usual then the "young" lads moved on in their respective lives and whilst Meare carried on it was not quite so successful afterwards.
