Honeygar Farm, Westhay

Somerset Wildlife Trust is currently planning a major fundraising campaign to enable it to buy Honeygar Farm from the Esmee Fairbairn Foundation by early 2023. Honeygar Farm is located between the Trust's Westhay Moor NNR, Westhay Heath and Catcott Nature reservice in the Avalon Marshes, one of the largest and most important wetland areas in the UK. Over the next decade the Trust will work with those who live and work in the area to develop its vision for the development of the buildings at Honeygar which will require a second major fundraising campaign.

The successful applicant will be required to attend a monthly evening Parish Council meeting. The meetings are usually on the 3rd Monday of each month except for August and December when meetings are not usually held. They will prepare, in consultation with appropriate members, agendas and minutes for meetings of the Council, to ensure all are prepared for approval

They will also be responsible for keeping the accounts for the Council, paying invoices, provide a monthly internal Summary of Account and produce accounts and records for the external annual auditor, reclaiming VAT and annual budgeting for the Precept.

BUTTERFLY WALKS

From Spring to early Autumn, groups of volunteers walk regular routes and record the species of butterflies they see. These routes (referred to as transects) are fixed so that the results of the surveys can be compared on a year-by-year basis, giving environmental scientists indicators of change. The data is fed to the **UK Butterfly Monitoring Scheme** (**UKBMS**) and is added together with the records from the annual *Big Butterfly Count* (performed in our gardens) plus other surveys called *Random Squares* – the latter giving a 'snapshot' of what is happening in that locality.

We're looking for more volunteers to join the regular survey teams. You don't have to be experienced, training is given and identification aids provided. The transect routes typically take two hours of steady walking and observation and, for various reasons, recorders should be in pairs.

Many routes are level walking though we do also have requirement for the Polden and Mendip Hill areas too where different butterflies occur but the walking is a slightly harder.

Each transect is surveyed weekly by volunteers on a 4 - 6 week rota so that is not onerous but you do get to see the range of butterfly species in that area. Good news is: butterfly surveys are done in fair weather.

New volunteers will be accompanied on the route by an experienced surveyor until they become familiar with species identification.

To ensure volunteers know whether they want to take part, we plan to do a series of escorted walks in February and March when we can describe in more



detail what is required. If you wish to book a place, please contact me either by phone, text or email.

The Government recently announced that funding would be available to provide grants for households in need of some short-term financial support where they are struggling to afford the cost of food, gas, electricity, oil and water bills, and other essential costs this winter. Doubtless, with the cuts to Universal Credit, rising fuel costs and inflation, there will be many such households in Somerset facing financial difficulties.

Within Somerset, the client grants are being distributed jointly by the five local Citizens Advice. As the fund is only open until 31st March 2022, we want to ensure that as many households-in-need as possible have the opportunity to access the financial support they need.

Your Questions Answered

The Somerset household support fund is designed to provide short-term financial support (from December to the end or March 2022 to vulnerable household which are struggling to afford the cost of food, gas, electricity, oil and water bills and other essential costs.

Funded by the DWP, administered by Somerset County Council and distributed by Citizens Advice Somerset.

Who can apply:-

You must live in the county of Somerset

You will be over the age of 16 and living independently of parents/

You are struggling to pay for essentials because you don't have enough money

You can provide the required proof of your identity, Somerset residency and proof of your benefits or proof of your income. (most recent/last months bank statements).

Can I get help if I work, am Retired or do not work al all?

Yes, there are many different reasons why it has become difficult to pay for essentials. The key thing is that you and your household are struggling to pay for essentials.

Will household support fund affect my benefits?

No, it will not affect your benefits

How do I apply?

You apply through a dedicated and secure web portal. Scan the QR code or type the following in google. hsf.citizensadvicesomerset.org.uk.



Before you start have the evidence you need ready. Proof of benefits, bank statements/transaction list for last months. You will need to have photos, scanned documents, screen prints, and pdfs are all okay to use.

What if I can't apply through the website?

If this is difficult for you there are lots of community groups, village agents, health coaches and other support organisations that know about this fund and will be able to assist you to apply through the web portal.

If you don't have any support and need help to apply.

Please call Somerset County Council on 03007906275. The somerset team will pass you contact details to your nearest Citizens Advice officer who will help you to make an application.

How long does it take to make an application?

Citizens Advice will process completed applications within 5 working days. Incomplete applications will not be processed until all the evidence required has been provided.

Suspected fraudulent applications will be investigated and may lead to criminal proceedings.
