port on page 22.





### <u>Thought for the day</u>

In our Home Group, we've been looking at prayer and what it means to us. We've looked at the topic of, 'Asking for others' and how this simple request is often a great help to people at their time of need.

People are often surrounded and totally absorbed in everyday life in all its distractions and busyness; there is almost no time to breathe. When a major event occurs, an illness, a car accident of someone close in the family, the death of a friend in the village, they become overwhelmed by it all.

That is especially true at times like these that we are asked to pray for the needs of others. Prayer is a way of talking directly to God, and this is open to everyone; you don't have to be 'special', religious, go to church, or be an Anglican Archbishop. God listens to all our prayers. He even knows what we are going to pray about, before we actually do, as He knows our hearts.

Not every prayer is answered immediately, or in the way we expect. God has His plan and often it is much later that we understand how things have happened for the best, and not in the way we thought. Pain and suffering are much more tolerable when shared; very much harder on your own to cope with. The Bible at 2 Corinthians ch1 v3-4 says, "*s Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion the God of all comfort, \* who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God."* Sharing your suffering can bring comfort.

At the beginning of the year, we started to pray each week for a specific area of Meare, and working towards Westhay. So far, we've prayed for Stileway, Glastonbury Road, Porter's Hatch and Church Lane. Muddy Lane, Bramble Close and The Levels will have followed, by the time this goes to print. If you have felt blessed, you could email and let us know. If you have any prayer needs, we would be happy to include you in our prayers. In the book of Philippians ch4 v6, the Apostle Paul wrote, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." If you have not considered prayer as a means for seeking comfort in times of distress, you only need to ask God. Most recently, he was chosen to sing in a Masterclass given by Simon Leper, one of the two répétiteurs in conjunction with the BBC's Cardiff Singer of the World Competition.

### Get set for blooming Summer colour

For the past few years and with the help of some amazing volunteers and plant donations from parishioners, The Meare and Westhay Fundraising Team (MWFT) has financed the upkeep and looked after several planted areas, for parishioners and visitors to enjoy.



Thanks to Victoria Winter and Roger Stacey providing heavy machinery, and two weekends' work by our volunteers, the overgrown area next to the Church rooms has been turned into a tidy and attractive car park, with bulb-filled troughs, barrels and beds.

This year's bulbs are also popping up in the planted areas at The



Meare sign, Porters Hatch, Kirlegate and Back Lane and a petrol mower has been offered to us so it should be easier to cut around the bulbs this summer as it was taking ages with a strimmer! Grass cutting around the area with rose bushes opposite Porter's Hatch will now be taken care of by the Parish Council's appointed contractor to minimise the danger to our volunteers.

This year we plan to reduce the height and number of shrubs and

plants in the flower bed at the Meare sign as you enter the village, due to concerns that they could distract drivers as they negotiate the bend.

Following the success of the wheelbarrows planted up last year for the Queen's Jubilee (despite the long drought!), we will once again put them out at Kirlegate and Porters Hatch in time for the King's Coronation. The barrows will be removed once the plants are no longer in flower.



Our intrepid volunteers, Lyn Appleton and Lee Gage who do the lion's share of the gardening in all these areas, hope you enjoy the colourful displays in our planted areas as you walk around the village.

They would welcome help from anyone living nearby to tidy up any rubbish that appears and to provide much needed water during the growing season so that all the planted areas stay looking attractive.

## **Clerks Report**

### Villager of the Year

There are many people who steadfastly work quietly away to ensure that tasks in and around Meare and Westhay are completed. Others dedicate many hours of their time to ensure that the organisations and activities of the parish continue to the benefit of others. Some people are simply great neighbours, looking out to the needs of the elderly and infirm, providing care support, running errands or simply being there with a shoulder to cry on. Why not acknowledge the enormous value of those who do so much for our parish and nominate them for the Villager of the Year award. There are a few guidelines and rules to follow when nominating someone. They are:

- Nominated people must live in the parish
- Parish Councillors cannot be nominated
- The award is for an individual, not an organisation or business.
- Applications are to be supported by a short statement as to why this person is considered worthy of an award.

### Finger posts

A fingerpost (sometimes referred to as a guide post) is a traditional type of sign. There are many examples in and around the villages of Meare and Westhay. Indeed, the Parish Council commissioned the renovation of the finger posts recently and many have observed and approved the decision to renovate the signs. The posts are traditionally made of cast iron, although some (not in our parish) are made of wood

Legislation was enacted in 1697, allowing magistrates to place directional signs at crossroads. They became compulsory in 1773 when the Turnpike Roads Act was introduced. For the next 200 years or so, the humble finger post quietly did its job, directing traveler's and assisting with navigating around the country, particularly the rural communities.

In 1933, the Colour and font used on a finger post was standardized. Just a few years later, in an attempt to confuse an invading enemy, finger posts were removed during the war and not reinstated until the late 1940's. The next change came in 1964 when the Traffic Signs Regulations act was passed which allowed local authorities to erect signs other than finger posts. When signs were originally designed and located at junctions, the 40ft articulated lorry had not evolved and some signs have subsequently fallen foul of tight turns and damage. The parish council became aware that the finger post on Shapwick Road pointing towards Burtle was constantly being hit by long, high sided vehicles, with the unsuspecting motorist wondering why they were being directed into a private drive, rather than towards Burtle. To overcome the problem, the sign has been redesigned, with the word Highbridge being replaced with H Bridge. It appears that not everyone is happy with the alteration!

First and foremost, the Parish Council has correctly followed legislation and guidance. The amendment to the sign is permitted. However, should the Council wish to revoke the decision to amend the sign and replace it with the original one, there is a problem. Councils, once having taken a decision are restrained from revisiting that decision for a minimum of six months. I suspect that parishioners will either wish to see the old sign returned, are happy with the amended sign, or simply don't mind either way! The parish council will gather opinion over the next few months and if required, revisit the original decision.

#### Meare Parish Council supports the Village Hall project

I observe there may be some misunderstandings on the PC's support for the new Village Hall. Councillors are aware of the need for a new facility, the playing field, which is owned by the PC seems the ideal location.

The playing field is owned by the PC and the field and the new build village hall programme is currently managed by the Meare and Westhay Village Hall and Playing Field Committee (MWVH). The PC applied for and obtained planning consent and have secured a  $\pounds 200,000$  loan. An agreement between the PC and MWVH has not yet been reached as to the triggers when the loan will be released. There is an expectation that the loan will be used as match funding for other grants. On receipt of a schedule of works, identified sources of additional funding shared and a programme of works agreed, the parish council will release funds accordingly. What the council are trying to avoid is having a partially built hall that cannot be used, money for completion has run out, yet the loan obtained still has to be paid.

I remain convinced that providing all parties involved are prepared to work together, the problems explained can be resolved. Gerard Tucker – Clerk . P C Meetings, Monday 17th April and Monday 15th May.



### Progress

Since our last update and tender process, we are delighted to have selected a preferred contractor Melhuish and Saunders Ltd, based in Glastonbury. We have been working with them, our structural engineer and our architect, looking at different value engineering options to reduce the overall build costs. A number of these options are now being priced so we can get a firm quotation for the build costs.

We are having on-going discussions with the Parish Council regarding the Public Works Loan conditions. This is the loan that the PC agreed to give as a grant to the Village Hall charity in July 2022, however unfortunately this has not yet been resolved which is impeding further fundraising efforts. We hope to be able to agree the loan conditions soon, to enable further grant seeking success.

### Events

On 24<sup>th</sup> January, we held an open meeting where we presented our latest progress update and the plans for the hall. This was well attended with questions raised by the community and addressed. A copy of the slides can be found on our website:

On 4<sup>th</sup> April, we will hold our AGMs for our two charities that are currently in place: 7.30 to 8.30pm Meare and Westhay Village Hall and Playing field Charity No 1063258 and 8.30 to 9.30pm Meare and Westhay Village Hall Charity No 1200097 at the Community Church on Church Path, Meare.

There are two charities currently as we have recently registered a new CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation). The original charity is unable to place contracts so cannot actually build the village hall, so we require a CIO in order to do this. We are in the process of transferring the assets from the old charity to the new CIO, hence there are two charities at present. Nominations for trustees have been invited with a closing date of 20<sup>th</sup> March 2023 (noting this date will have passed by the time this comes to print).

#### **Events cont.**

Following the success of our Children's Christmas Craft workshop last December, we will be holding an Easter craft workshop for children on 1<sup>st</sup> April. All ages are welcome and it should be a fun family session making Easter crafts.

### Fundraising

At the time of writing we are also planning our two Mosaic Workshops taking place on 18<sup>th</sup> March which we are delighted to say are fully sold out, with a long waiting list in place. They proved to be so popular, we



have put on a second workshop on and we're looking forward to making some beautiful mosaic birds.


