Somerset Wildlife Trust

Homes for Hedgehogs is launched to help halt the dramatic decline of one of the UK's most charismatic and best-loved species. It was launched on Monday 3rd July, its a county-wide campaign designed to raise awareness of and help reverse the decline of the humble hedgehog. Numbers have been in decline since the 1950s. Then, there was an estimated 30 million of our prickly friends in the UK. In 2020, this number was at just under 900,000. It is hoped that the campaign will see large numbers of people making small changes to their gardens and green spaces to turn the fortunes of this magical little mammal around, before we lose it forever. Thought for the day

Our recent teaching in Sunday services has been from the book of James in the New Testament. We've learnt how enduring the trials of life builds our character and develops Christian maturity. We were confronted by the thought that the tongue is a very dangerous weapon, to be used carefully and thoughtfully; and the reason we have two ears and one mouth is to make us better listeners, so we should be slow to speak and not rush in to say things we may regret later.

As we progressed through the book of James, we learnt the benefits of humility and wisdom in how we approach life, in contrast to selfish ambition and envy which are not from heaven or the way God wants us to live. These traits create disorder and chaos, hardly characteristics for living at peace with each other.

Towards the end of James's letter, we read about submitting ourselves to the will of God living in the ways He encourages. That we should step away from undesirable things and not to quarrel and fight or kill for the things we cannot get. We also learnt that if we are sick or in need, we should ask the Elders for prayer. Answered prayers are very encouraging and we've seen prayers answered recently through a liver transplant for a friend of someone in our congregation. Wonderful news it was too, against the odds.

Where are you sitting on the fence of life? In a nice garden on one side (Confidently trusting and believing in God), or perched on the fence wondering what life is like in that garden? If you are curious to know more, come and receive a warm welcome on a Sunday morning at the Chapel. Coffee at 10:30 for 11:00 service start.

At the beginning of the year, the Meare Community Church congregation started to pray each week for a specific area of Meare, and are working towards Westhay. Through June and July we have prayed for: Sunnymeade, Moorview Close, St Marys Road, Downs Orchard, Alexanders Close, Countrymen Close, and Oxenpill. In the book of Matthew ch6 v25, Matthew wrote, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?" Police Freud Warning

The police have once again put online that Fraud is up again. Their website warns that, "Once fraudsters establish contact, they manipulate their victims with convincing stories, often claiming that there has been fraudulent activity on their bank accounts".

"The best thing to do is to remember **Take Five, Tell Two** – that is to take five minutes to consider if you might be being scammed and tell two other people who may be able to spot red flags you can't in a pressurised situation.

We can 100 per cent guarantee though that the police or your bank will <u>never</u> ask you to withdraw cash or buy jewellery as part of any enquiries. You will also <u>never</u> be asked to lie to your bank. No matter how insistent or convincing the fraudster is, if you are told to do that we can guarantee it is a scam and you should hang up immediately and report it to Action Fraud.

If you think you are being scammed, but are worried and need to contact your bank. If you can, use a different phone to the one the fraudster rang you on. If not make sure there is a dialling tone on your phone before calling our bank.

Your bank or the police will never call and ask you to verify your personal details or PIN. Never send a courier to your home to collect your cash, bank cards, PINs, or any other valuable goods. The police will never contact you out of the blue and ask you to participate in an investigation that requires you to withdraw money from your bank, or to purchase high value goods, such as jewellery or gold.

Race Night raises over £1K

The Race night held on the 20th May at the Church Rooms proved to be a roaring success (literally!). Over 60 parishioners and friends packed the hall to support the event jointly organised by Meare Parish Activity Group (MPAG) and Meare & Westhay Fundraising Team (MWFT) to raise funds for the Meare Youth Group Sports facility for the village.

For only £5.00 a ticket, participants enjoyed a ploughman's supper and dessert, while betting on 8 thrilling horse races. Local organisations sponsored each race enabling them to name the 8 horses in their race. They were Glastonbury-based CJW Taxis; The Sheppey Pub in Godney; River House Airbnb in Meare; local Handyman Tim, party entertainment supplier Banto Party's; Shapwick-based dog agility training SWAT; Wisden cricket almanac specialist Somerset Badger and M Franks & Sons family funeral directors.

Every horse in each race was auctioned to the highest bidder and then punters placed bets of $\pounds 2.00$ per horse on the ones they fancied. 50% of the total auction money raised was awarded to the winning owner and 40% of the entire tote went to the first placed horse and 20% to the second in each race. Overall the event raised $\pounds 1,088.59$, including pre-purchased drink packages.

Thank you to all that took and donated in the June table top sale and other donations including Gwilliam's of Edington, MakingaDifference@NisaRetail.com which added another fantastic sum of £250 grant. Which brings the running total of the funds raised so far for the Sports facility to an impressive £5991.09! Watch this space for more events to be planned later in the year.

Clerks Report

The parish council was saddened to receive a message from a resident from Westhay who had sadly lost her cat to being hit by a car. The message continued with a request that the Parish Council extends the 30 MPH restricted areas to cover the whole distance between Westhay and Meare. The Parish Council discussed this request at their last meeting and the clerk was asked to follow up this and other highways related matters with the appropriate departments. The response received proves that it is far from straightforward to extend speed limits, introduce new signage etc.

1. Traffic speed between Meare and Westhay, particularly the absence of speed restrictions in the vicinity of Homeway Farm

The Department for Transport guidance on the setting of local speed limits is clear in that speed limits should be evidence led, selfexplaining and seek to reinforce people's assessment of what is a safe speed to travel. They should encourage self-compliance and should be seen by drivers as a maximum rather than a target speed.

Research has shown that a change in speed limit signs alone has very little effect on actual vehicle speeds and that the speed of vehicles is moderated by the surrounding environment rather than the posted speed limit. Where motorists do not understand the reasoning behind the implementation of a speed limit, a high level of non-compliance is likely to occur, and indeed this may lead to disrespect of speed limits elsewhere.

The key factors that need to be considered when reviewing a speed limit is history of collisions; road geometry and engineering; road function; compositions of road users; existing traffic speeds; and road environment.

The Department for Transport states that reasonable minimum criteria for the definition of what constitutes a village, for the purpose of applying a village speed limit of 30 mph, is there's a minimum requirement of at least 20 houses fronting the road for a minimum distance of 600 metres and at an average density of three houses per 100 metres to qualify. Therefore, this bit of Meare, Homeway Corner, would not qualify.

The most recent speeds monitoring checks show that 85th%ile vehicle speeds between Westhay and Meare are 37mph and that there have been no Police recorded injury collisions reported in the last 5 years.

So, based on the lack of evidence of a speeding issue, road safety issue or congestion issue, if the parishioners wanted to pursue this, the speed limit would have to be funded by the Parish. It is estimated that the cost would be up to $\pounds 8,000$ - $\pounds 10,000$.

2. Traffic speed in Westhay, near the Old School.

Highways have informed the Parish Council that Road Narrows signage at both ends of the narrow part are ordered and will be installed when manufactured

3. Inconsiderate parking at various locations!

The Parish Council regularly receives complaints regarding vehicles parked in places which restricts the visibility of pedestrians and other road users. Near the Defibrillator Box [old telephone box] in Westhay is one example, others are in Meare. This is not an issue that can be resolved by Highways. However, if an obstruction, please call 101 – Police non-emergency line and report the concern.

The highways officer that we are engaging with informs that the School Keep Clear lines and a replacement post for the 30MPH repeater in Meare have been requested

Finally – a conundrum! Two posts have appeared at Porters Hatch on the verge – yet no one is aware as to why they are there. Despite asking many questions, we are no wiser.

In summary, there are clearly defined reasons why restrictions and signage cannot be implemented. The Parish Council now has to consider if spending up to $\pounds 10,000$ of its limited budget would be appropriate – or are there more pressing things in the parishes that need funding?

A New Museum in Street

The Alfred Gillett Trust, a heritage charity based in Street, Somerset, is building a new museum to display a vast collection of museum objects and archive material ranging from 200-million-year-old fossils to 200-years of shoemaking and Clarks shoes. In 2019 the Trust secured ownership of the historic collection about the history of Clarks shoes and is now planning a new museum to open by 2025 at the Grange, adjacent to Clarks Village, to make these available to the public. This will create a community hub and visitor experience celebrating the rich social and industrial history of shoemaking via three new galleries which will be just as much about people as they are about shoes and shoemaking. Our internationally significant ichthyosaur fossils will remain in their current location at the Grange, which will be refurbished to open up this fascinating collection as part of the new museum offer, and will be on permanent display to the public. Award-winning architects, Purcell, will redevelop the Grade II Listed Grange site in keeping with the landscape and history of the area, with the planning application now submitted. Sought after exhibition designers, Nissen Richards Studio will deliver the gallery experiences, creating amazing spaces that are thought provoking, inspirational, enjoyable and fun.

Rosie Martin, Director of the Alfred Gillett Trust said, "We're delighted that this amazing collection will be open to the public, adding to Somerset's rich and large array of iconic visitor attractions, as well as opening up our gardens for all to enjoy." 


