Meare Community Church Thought for the Day

You may have not thought very often about Alexander the Great, but he is a well recorded invader of territories west of Greece, who performed many unpleasant things as he took land by force; men of military age were put to the sword and women and children sold to slavery. People believed he existed and did all that the history books write about in ancient times. He was the King of Macedonia.

Another person of ancient times, although well recorded in 4 biographies that support each other, he was until recently very well respected and much believed. He did many much nicer things: restoring health, healing people, driving out demons, provided guidance on a way of living in harmony for those who believed. He apprenticed 12 disciples for 3 years and taught them about living in a new kingdom. He offered salvation for those who repented and believed, and the hope of eternal life.

The authorities did not get on well with this upstart and had him put to death in the most painful way possible, by crucifixion. After being buried in a sealed tomb for 3 days, women found his tomb open, and body gone. He reappeared to over 500 people over a number of days. Even those disciples who doubted, finally realised who he was. One biographer recalls our mystery man saying "Who do you say I am?"

Roman historians wrote about his life, and his empty tomb. The biographers wrote about the apostles that preached His message under the threat of death. They must have been really convinced of His character. The evidence of who he was and what he did is so strong. Our mystery man, was Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God.

If the evidence is so strong, why do so few believe he existed or was who he said he was? Do you doubt He existed or did those miracles? If Jesus came to die for our sins, in the most painful way possible, why should you ignore what He did for you? This year at Christmas, have a think about what Christmas is really all about. Christmas is not about presents and excessive celebratory consumption, it's about a new start in your life. Prayers were ongoing for Westhay in September and October, we have prayed for our villages road by road and will continue to do so.

Our October celebrations of 700 years of St Mary and All saints Church were really enjoyable providing three days of events and exhibitions for the communities of Meare and Westhay. It started on Friday 13th October with Meare schoolchildren and staff having an exciting time on a treasure trail devised by Rev Kieron Rowley, around the church. This was based on our new colourful history leaflet which features "treasures" from the 13th-20th centuries.



Saturday 14th October

was a sociable day as many people came to admire the displays of flowers and photos and archive records of events held in the church from 1800s onwards. Many



thanks to all those who made donations and contributed photos and material and set it all up, or acted as stewards and guides, and to the bellringers who demonstrated their skills. A wonderful team of helpers provided cakes and refreshments all day leading up to the organ recital by Matthew Redman at 4.00 pm with an entertaining program of music from 1360 up to the 21st century.

MWFT started Breakfast earlier on Sunday, giving people time to eat before the Sunday Service. It was a complete sell out.



Sunday 15th October was a memorable day with Bishop Ruth of Taunton speaking at our special Thanksgiving Service which was attended by the St Johns choir and members from the Glastonbury churches and Meare Community Church. This was followed by a delicious buffet lunch and wine and another chance to meet friends

and discover and share memories of events at the church, such as the 2006 removal and return of the six heavy bells sent on a lorry to London for re tuning.

We will keep an archive of all the exhibition for future generations to enjoy. In the meantime all are welcome to visit the church, pick up a history leaflet and come and join in the Christmas services shown below.

Police

Between the 9th and 15th of October, Avon and Somerset Police took part in a co-ordinated regional operation to pursue and disrupt the activities of county lines drug gangs.

Using intelligence gathered over many months, officers executed warrants to search properties where illegal drug activity was suspected. Our roads policing team targeted vehicles suspected of involvement in county lines activity across the south west.

They made 21 arrests, safeguarded 9 adults and children, seized \pounds 230 k of cocaine, heroin and cannabis and 44 k in cash.

Neighbourhood teams engaged with schools and communities to talk about what exploitation looks like, and carried out welfare checks on vulnerable children and young adults.

They use information submitted by our communities to build up a picture about criminal activity. If you suspect drug related activity is happening where you live or someone you know could be exploited, call 101, report online or tell Crimestoppers on 0800555111.
