Although we live in a lovely part of the world, with great views all around, one of our family Christmas presents to each other was to make sure we booked a few days away together, to make time for each




other and make happy memories. So this is what I've started to plan.

#### The Joy of counting Butterflies

Last year after seeing an advert asking for volunteers for butterfly surveys, I joined a team at the Hawk and Owl Reserve in Shapwick and would like to say, and I think I speak for the rest of the team, how enjoyable this has been. We had very little knowledge of butterflies when we started in April, but thanks to Fred Giles were given guidance on how to identify the species to be able to perform the butterfly count. The paperwork was very easy meaning we could simply follow the marked route, list what we had seen and send the report sheet by email – nothing complicated at all. We also had regular summaries so we could see how the species and numbers change over the months.

Because we were looking for butterflies we have been surprised at what other insects we saw and found ourselves sharing photos and identifying those also. Although the counts stopped at the end of September we still meet up from time to time for a walk purely for the social side.

This is the first time counts have been done at this site and we are all looking forward to starting again in the spring so that the differences can be recorded and monitored year on year. #### **Somerset Waste Changes**

Sorry for any delays to waste collections after Christmas. This was due to heavy post-Christmas loads, vehicle issues and weather conditions. A new collocation day starts on 12<sup>th</sup> February 2024, for some. If you have not received a letter, your day will be staying the same.

You can now dispose of some DIY waste free of charge at recycling sites – but you need to book ahead. (limits apply, see website).

Some of you will soon be part of a trial for a new type of recycling container. The trial will see black boxes (used for paper and card) swapped out for a black bag. The Switch is expected to save  $\pounds 60,000$  per year. We will be only swapping when replacement boxes are required and using existing stocks of black boxes first.




The 10<sup>th</sup> of December, saw some very excited children arrive at Meare Church Rooms, for our first Christmas event, a party with a difference.

#### **INSECT SURVEY WALKS**

Each year from Spring to early Autumn, groups of volunteers across the UK follow regular routes where they identify and count Butterflies, Bumblebees and other insects. Taking part is both sociable and rewarding especially as personal knowledge improves. New volunteers are often surprised at how many varieties they see during the seasons, improving the awareness and appreciation of our native species.

The routes (called Transects) are fixed so that surveys can be compared on a year-by-year basis, giving environmental scientists indicators of change. Data is fed to **Butterfly Conservation, Bumblebee Conservation Trust** and the **British Dragonfly Society** but also goes to the local reserve managers helping them maintain and adapt practices to protect our precious insect life.

We're looking for more volunteers to join the regular teams as well as to establish new survey routes across the region. You don't have to be experienced, training is given and identification aids provided as part of the welcome pack.

Typically, a survey takes around two hours of steady walking and is done in pairs or very small groups.

Some routes are level walking but we do have need for volunteers on some of the more hilly regions.

Each route is surveyed on a weekly rota in the case of butterflies and monthly for either bumblebees or dragonflies so that it's not too onerous but you do get to see the range of species in that area.

Good news: these surveys are done in fair weather .---

New volunteers will be accompanied by an experienced surveyor until they become familiar with species identification.

We plan to do a series of escorted walks in March when we can describe in more detail what is required.


