FROM THE CLERK TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

Summer has rolled on and it's been rather glorious weather, hasn't it? The sunshine doesn't stop the wheels of the Parish Council from turning though and work continues on our ongoing projects. Here are some Parish updates:

- Allotments Meare Parish Council continue to work closely with Meare
 Allotment Association to ensure that maintenance issues at the allotments
 have a satisfactory outcome. Cllr Alvin Neale meets with Axe Brue Internal
 Drainage Board soon to discuss drainage issues.
- Village Hall –The formal agreement between Meare Parish Council and the village hall trustees is getting very close to being agreed and fundraising remains priority.
- Banking The Parish Council is currently moving their bank accounts from the
 Coop to Unity Trust Bank. This move will allow payments to be made to
 suppliers via bacs rather than using cheques that are currently sent out in the
 post, also negating and saving on postage costs. In addition, funds held for
 the building of the village hall will benefit from increased rates of interest from
 those with the current bank.
- Meare Parish Playing Field and Play Area Update The Parish Council instructed a full service on the zip wire in the playing field this year as well as the annual Play Area Inspection in which the play area is declared fully safe to use. We are working through several recommendations within the report, including removing the pole close to the outdoor gym equipment. There is still some work to do to fencing, posts and railings, and we await contractors' dates for when works can commence.

NB: To book the field for an event, please contact me at clerk@meare-pc.gov.uk. A month's notice is preferred, allowing the Parish Council to organise the mowing in readiness for your event and for us to avoid mowing on the day you want to use the field.



- Fly tipping This has become an increasing problem in the Parish and is reported regularly to Somerset Council. If you do see or are aware of any fly tipping taking place, please do report it to Clerk@meare-pc.gov.uk. We realise that rubbish doesn't always disappear very quickly but can assure parishioners that we do give this problem our full attention.
- Councillor Vacancies- In the summer issue of the Magazine, we reported two vacancies for Parish Councillors. Sadly, we also received the resignation of Cllr Nicky Hoskins. After following protocols for the recruitment of replacement councillors, we extend a very warm welcome to Cllr Adam Lusby, Cllr Rosie Lander and Cllr Rita Wren. This was the first time I had been through the process of recruiting councillors, and I learnt a lot. All resignations of councillors have to be reported to the Returning Officer at Somerset Council and notices to recruit are initiated by them. There are two ways to recruit. The first, and preferred route, is to coopt new councillors into the council. The second way, by far the most expensive, is via an election. This is triggered when ten parishioners write to the Returning Officer requesting an election. Then the Parish Council has no choice but to go down this path at great cost to the Parish Council and ultimately you, the parishioners. Fortunately, on this occasion we avoided an election and a bill of up to £4000.00 from Somerset Council, as we only received three applicants for the vacant positions, and they were uncontested. However, this did highlight the need to budget for elections in our next precept. We recently received Cllr Teresa James' resignation and, at the time of submitting this copy, we await news from Somerset Council as to whether an election is required. We wish to thank Cllr James for her contribution to the Parish Council and the wider community during her time as a councillor. Cllr James ran a very successful Health and Wellbeing event in the village at the beginning of the summer, which was very well received.
- Meare & Westhay Parish Magazine- some of you may already be aware that Joe Dugdale and Sylv Kerslake resigned from their position as editors of the Parish Magazine. In the last issue we asked for anyone interested in applying for this position to contact us and as a result of the recruitment process, Helen Mitchell was interviewed and was the successful applicant. On behalf of Meare Parish Council we wish to welcome Helen and also say a big thank you to Joe and Sylv for their valued contribution during their tenure as editors. We wish you luck in your new ventures.

Special events include Roman days with Marcus Medicus on 20th and 21st August, and a celebration of Haerfest on 31st August. These are drop-in events. Normal admission applies but tickets give access till the end of the year, so its great value!

We have guided tours available on 13th August, 27th August and 24th September. These tours are aimed at adults and are times to fit in with the bus service. They must be booked in advance, but are a wonderful opportunity to learn much more about the creation of the various buildings, and the archaeology they are based on.



MEARE & WESTHAY FUNDRAISING TEAM



In 2023 Meare & Westhay Fundraising Team (MWFT) started re-cycling aluminium drinks cans to raise money for equipment for the youth of the parish. This money went towards to Multi Gym equipment in the Playground in Meare in 2024. We continue to collect the cans (drink cans only please) to raise money, and on average turn the cans into £50 a month, the Meare Spring Event raising over £100.

Currently we have two collection points in the parish, The Dairy in Westhay and the Playing Fields in Meare; there are hand crushers at both these points. Crushing to flatten them helps to limit the number of journeys to the recycling centre. We also have regular donations from Sweets tea rooms and South West Agility Training who separate them from their normal rubbish for us, which we are really grateful for.

If you want to separate yours from your weekly recycling and can't get to one of the collection points please let any MWFT person know and we will come and collect them from you. Imagine if everyone did this in the parish how much we could raise. Thank you.
