

FROM THE CLERK TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

The summer of 2025 proved to be dry and sunny meaning everyone had plenty of opportunity to be outdoors.

Allotments – Representatives from Meare Parish Council (MPC) met with the representatives from Meare Allotment Association (MAA) at the end of August. A better understanding of how the two parties work was achieved, and it was agreed that all maintenance issues at the allotments were the responsibility of the MAA with support from MPC. We will continue to work closely and have regular annual meetings to review and work through any issues. (See Village Life for further information about allotments.)

Village Hall –The formal Memorandum of Understanding between MPC and the Village Hall Trustees was signed at the Parish Council Meeting on 15th September 2025.

Parish Council Meeting Dates- the Parish Council Meetings are held at 7.30pm in the Community Church on the 3rd Monday of every calendar month (except August and December). See Magazine Diary for dates.

Banking – The Parish Council has successfully completed the move from Coop Bank to Unity Trust Bank. This move will allow payments

to be made to suppliers via Bacs rather than using cheques. Work continues to move funds held for the building of the village hall to accounts offering improved interest rates.



Finance- External auditors concluded the audit of Meare Parish Council for the year ended 31st March 2025. Notice of the conclusion was published on 16th September.

Meare Parish Playing Field and Play Area Update – Our playing field achieved an award from Somerset Playing Fields Association in September. Cllr Tristan Foster went along to their AGM to represent MPC and collect the award. Cllr Colin Foster also carries out regular maintenance at the playing field but was unable to join the presentation ceremony due to previous commitments. Our thanks and those of the community go to you both for the time you put in maintaining this great community asset. (See Village Life for details of how to book the field.)

Some of the Adult Outdoor Fitness equipment items in the play area became loose and dangerous to use when the ground was very dry during the summer months. The installation engineer has visited the site, and any remedial repairs will be carried out.



Fly tipping – This continues to be a problem in our Parish. If you do see or are aware of any fly tipping taking place, please do report it via the Clerk. MPC would like to extend their gratitude and sincere thanks to those members of the community that have spent their own time clearing up and disposing of the rubbish that has been fly tipped at Westhay Picnic area. This land is the property of Somerset Council, who have also cleared up fly tipping to this land on more than one occasion.

Councillor Vacancies- Following the resignation of Cllr Teresa James in June of this year, MPC co-opted a new member to our council at our Parish Council meeting on the 15thSeptember. We would like to extend a very warm welcome to Cllr Sharon Bond and look forward to working with you.

Garden and Boundary Maintenance - it was recently suggested to MPC that they should maintain privately owned hedges and boundaries where they may cause either an obstruction to a pavement or cause visibility problems. Unfortunately, councillors are not legally able to carry out this work to private property. The Council do use a local contractor, who is fully insured to carry out this type of work, to maintain any property owned by the Parish Council.

Update from Tessa Munt, MP for Meare and Westhay

I hope you've had a wonderful summer. I've enjoyed meeting many of you at local events and my surgeries across the patch. Thank you if you came to say hello, share your views and ask questions.

My summer diary included fascinating visits to Honeygar Farm and Westhay Moor to see the Somerset Wildlife Trust's restoration work. I shall watch their progress with interest.

I hosted my first 'youth' surgeries this summer and it was good to hear from young people about their hopes and concerns. It is likely that today's 12 year olds and upwards will be able to vote at the next General Election and it's interesting to know what the next generation really cares about.

I've made my concerns about the Environment Agency's planned withdrawal of main river maintenance and the potential for flooding in this part of Somerset very clear. I attended the South West Association of Drainage Authorities (SWADA) emergency meeting about the situation and when Parliament returned in early September, I requested Ministerial intervention.

We face other challenges here. For many of us, a main hospital is miles away and big changes in the NHS are afoot. I attended the Committee meeting when community hospital bed closures were discussed and have held further discussions with NHS Leaders, seeking reassurance that patients and carers will receive *improved* services when changes are made, rather than relying on promises that more services will come "soon".

I met specialists at the Royal Marsden Hospital working with the latest Radiotherapy machines – amazing! I've pressed the Government for years on updating NHS machines. I was also interviewed by Channel 4 News on research into the condition ME, on which I continue to campaign.

Thank you if you've contacted me – I am here to represent you. A full list of my surgeries is available if you call or email me. No appointment is necessary - it's first come, first served. If you can't come to meet me, I'll come to see you.

It has been a busy summer at Honeygar, with many of the PhD researchers taking the opportunity to step away from the lecture theatre and do some field work whilst their undergraduate students are on holiday. Our volunteers have also been hard at work monitoring dragonflies and butterflies in addition to their regular work, as well as making a huge effort to eliminate invasive Himalayan Balsam by pulling it up before it can spread its seeds.

Thank you to all those who were able to join us on the 12th of July and to everyone that has subsequently completed our survey, either online or in paper form. We are collating the responses we have received and will use them to feed into our final planning application for the conversion and redevelopment of the buildings. We are now expecting to make the planning application in January 2026.

The information boards that were available at our event in April are still in place (near the entrance to the farmyard from Burtle Road), so please feel free to visit and read more about our plans. If we are in the office, pop in and say hello. If you have any queries, please email Adam on adam.preece@somersetwildlife.org or call 07783 516 611.

We are still waiting for planning permission for the wildlife tower we want to build just to the north of the buildings but have begun to gather materials from around the yard and store them on the proposed site – those of you who walk to Honeygar may have noticed piles of rubble appearing on the northern side of the footpath. A wildlife tower is a very small building that provides nesting and hibernation opportunities for a huge range of wildlife. The tower proposed for Honeygar has nest boxes for barn owls, little owls and kestrels together with warm and cold bat roosts built into it. Rubble will be piled around the bottom of it to provide a habitat for reptiles and amphibians, whilst the outside face will be untreated larch wood, to attract a range of small birds and invertebrates. We were hoping to get permission in time to complete groundworks before it gets too wet underfoot but it was, sadly, not to be. Assuming we receive the permission in time, the builders will be back in the spring to build the tower.



Steve provides all kinds of support: emotional, spiritual and practical, including giving SIM cards to the seafarers so that they can make contact with their families who are so far away.

As a result of that, some of the ladies from the parish thought it would be a good idea to collect useful items to pass on to Steve for distribution to those on the ships. 
